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Chair's Report

It's been a year of anticipation. With our reinvigorated branding of the TOGETHER programme, Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow, the Foundation has set the scene for a new period of growth.

The Foundation has amended its investment settings to augment the long-term performance of both our Endowment Fund (set up for collections development) and our Activities Fund (set up to support other Gallery activities). The funds have been shifted to balanced/growth and balanced portfolios, respectively. We have closely watched the funds bear the first green shoots of growth and look forward to directing the surplus towards the needs of the Gallery and, most excitingly, the first Endowment Fund acquisition next year.

It's now up to the Gallery acquisitions team, and we wait with interest as they scan the horizon and look for the next great work.

In the meantime, we look forward to unveiling a new artwork by Yona Lee that was commissioned last year and supported by a special group of donors and dedicated fundraising. We will enjoy the moment in December when we are rewarded with a sculpture that has been carefully conceived and assembled to mark the 20th anniversary of the Gallery building.

We paid heed to the past and celebrated the now at our Gala Dinner in October with a successful fundraising campaign for the conservation work needed on the frame of one of Ōtautahi Christchurch's most beloved works: Petrus van der Velden's Burial in the Winter on the Island of Marken (also known as The Dutch Funeral). The Foundation proudly supports the Gallery's focus on maintaining and restoring its collection and welcomes the call for expanded areas of support.

The Foundation's long-term vision serves to anticipate the challenges and opportunities faced by the Gallery. What's behind us is in front of us, and we thank you for joining together in our cause.

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Director's Report

In a striking reflection of the generosity of the Foundation's patrons, we are eagerly anticipating the enlivening of our understairs space by Yona Lee's wonderful Fountain in Transport. Lee's sculptural work was commissioned by the Foundation last year to mark the building's 20th birthday.

Fundraising is an ongoing activity for most public galleries, and it is no different here at Christchurch Art Gallery Te Puna o Waiwhetū. We are extraordinarily lucky to have a wonderful group of supporters behind us, whose generosity has made it possible for us to generate funds above and beyond the Gallery's normal budgets and running costs. This additional funding might be used to support ambitious acquisitions for the collection, or to fund important publications or large-scale exhibition projects. But at our Gala Dinner in September, we asked our guests to

support something a little different the conservation of the large golden frame that surrounds one of Ōtautahi Christchurch's great treasures and a firm favourite of our audiences. Commonly referred to as The Dutch Funeral, Petrus van der Velden's 1875 wintry masterpiece Burial in the Winter on the Island of Marken has been enthralling gallerygoers since 1932 when Henry van Asch generously donated the work to the then newly opened Robert McDougall Art Gallery. In 1986, a group of supporters generously raised funds to ensure that the painting itself was expertly cleaned of years of surface grime and restored for future generations to enjoy. However, at the time, funds were not available to restore the painting's imposingly large and decorative gold frame, and the decision was made to spray paint the frame rather than investing in a full re-gilding. The history of this painting is entwined with the Gallery's history, and speaks to the generosity and vision of those before us, and our role now as kaitiaki. We have a responsibility to play our part, ensuring that the foresight and kindness of those before us is acknowledged, cared for and preserved for the art lovers of tomorrow. We are deeply grateful for the past support that has brought us to this point. I'm happy to say that the generosity of our dinner guests will be reflected in the brilliance of real gold leaf applied skilfully, and in the traditional way, by a highly trained

conservator. There are many months of work ahead, and in time this work will again be surrounded by the frame it deserves. It's a beautiful way to play our part in the long life of this much-loved Christchurch Art Gallery treasure.

GILT: A Golden Night to Remember lived up to its name, and we were grateful in particular to chef Ben Bayly and Don McGlashan for contributing their significant talents to the success of the evening – along with the many others who made the night such a success.

The work that the Foundation and our TOGETHER programme has done and continues to do during good times and challenging times is incredible and will have a lasting impact for generations to come. 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TOGETHER, our mission is to build a community of support for Christchurch Art Gallery Te Puna o Waiwhetū to allow it to thrive and grow.

The funds received from our TOGETHER supporters for the purpose of the Endowment (for collections development) are in good hands. The \$5 million has been invested in the following funds:

a. Jarden Securities Portfolio (around 90% of the total fund) is "Balanced/ Growth" with a target allocation of around 30% in income assets and 70% in growth assets.

b. Continuity Capital Private Equity Funds 2 and 4 (around 10% of the total fund).

The Foundation has resolved to keep the Endowment Fund at a CPI annually adjusted value of \$5 million and to use the income generated to acquire significant works of art every two to three years. So far, the fund has generated surplus funds available for future acquisitions of around \$250,000. We look forward to announcing the first acquisition from the fund in 2025.

Thanks to the generosity of our TOGETHER supporters, the Foundation has launched a second fund which is aimed at lending support to the Gallery's other activities. The Activities Fund allocation is near \$1 million and is invested in the following fund:

a. Jarden Securities Portfolio is "Balanced" with a target allocation of around 40% in income assets and 60% in growth assets.

Our Board has expertise in investment and financial management and good oversight of its investments. It meets bi-monthly and reviews the fund at each meeting. Johnny Cochrane (Managing Director) and Hannah Donaldson, wealth management advisers from Jarden, report to the Board on a six-monthly basis.

Notes to Summary Financial Statements

Basis of Preparation

These summary financial statements were authorised for issue by the Christchurch Art Gallery Foundation ("Foundation") board members. The specific disclosures included in these summary financial statements have been extracted from the full financial statements. The summary financial statements cannot be expected to provide as complete an understanding as provided by the full financial statements. The information has been prepared using consistent accounting policies to the audited financial statements of the Trust. The full financial statements have been prepared in accordance with PBE SPFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity. A copy of the full financial statements is available from the Charities Services website.

Investments

Investments have been stated at fair value in the financial statements.

Restricted Cash

The Foundation has internally allocated a portion of the bank accounts to donate to Christchurch Art Gallery. The restricted cash totals \$525,676.

Donations

The Foundation made cash donations of \$65,000 to Christchurch Art Gallery during the year.

Legacy from the Estate of Sir Miles Warren

On the 9th June 2023 the Foundation received a \$1.500.000 legacy from the Estate of Sir Miles Warren. The deposit was allocated as follows:

- *\$535,000 allocated to the TOGETHER campaign to achieve the \$5 million endowment target
- * \$865,000 allocated to the Christchurch Art Gallery Activities Fund
- *\$100,000 to be tagged as unrestricted funds

As a result of this, the endowment target of \$5 million was reached on 30th June 2023.

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


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
